

## THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

*When the bell rings please stand to sing the ENTRANCE HYMN, no. 146.*

✠ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.  
**Amen.**

The Lord be with you  
**And also with you**

*The celebrant introduces the Mass and invites all to join in the PENITENTIAL ACT:*

**Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.**

*The ABSOLUTION follows. Then we sing the GLORIA IN EXCELSIS:*

**Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to his people on earth.  
Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks,  
we praise you for your glory.  
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world:  
have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:  
receive our prayer.  
For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,  
with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father.  
**Amen. Amen.****

*The COLLECT:* Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

*The FIRST READING*

PROVERBS 8:22-31

A reading from Proverbs.

The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep, when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep, when he assigned the sea its boundaries – and the waters will not invade the shore – when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman, delighting him day after day, ever at play in his presence, at play everywhere in his world, delighting to be with the sons of men.

*The SECOND READING*

ROM 5:1-15

A reading from the Letter to the Romans

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.

*We sing Alleluia and stand to greet the GOSPEL*      JOHN 13:31-33,34-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

**Glory to you O Lord**

Jesus said: 'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord

**Praise to you, O Christ**

*Please be seated for the SERMON.*

*Then stand to say together the CREED:*

**We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is,  
seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father;  
through him all things were made.**

**For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,  
was incarnate from the Holy spirit and the Virgin Mary  
and was made man.**

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the Prophets.**

**We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.**

**We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.**

**We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

## **THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST**

*The celebrant introduces the PEACE and then says:*

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

**And also with you.**

*We then sign the OFFERTORY HYMN, no. 373.*

*After the altar has been prepared, the celebrant says:*

Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

**May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.**

*The celebrant says the PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS to which all respond: **Amen.***

The Lord be with you

**And also with you**

Lift up your hearts

**we lift them to the Lord**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

*The celebrant sings the PREFACE.*

*The Eucharist Prayer continues until we sing the SANCTUS and BENEDICTUS:*

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory,  
Hosanna in the highest, Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest, Hosanna in the highest!**

*After the consecration the celebrant says:*

Great is the mystery of faith

**Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!**

*At the end of the prayer all say: Amen.*

## THE COMMUNION RITE

*The OUR FATHER is sung.*

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ

**Though we are many we are one body because we all share in one bread.**

*The AGNUS DEI is sung:*

**Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, redeemer of world, grant us peace.**

Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the lamb.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

*During the distribution of COMMUNION, the choir sings the ANTHEM.*

*Then please remain seated to sing the HYMN, no. 295.*

## THE CONCLUDING RITES

*The PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION is said:*

Almighty and eternal God, you have revealed yourself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and live and reign in the perfect unity of love: hold us firm in this faith, that we may know you in all your ways and evermore rejoice in your eternal glory, who are three Persons yet one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

*Then we say together:*

**Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.**

*Then the NOTICES are given. We stand to sing the FINAL HYMN no. 466.*

*The celebrant gives the BLESSING:*

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

...the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

The Mass is ended. Go in the peace of Christ.

**Thanks be to God.**
