PALM SUNDAY

Dear friends,

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred time in the Christian calendar. Christians turn resolutely to the lifegiving source not just of their faith, but reality itself. We are led into the darkness of violence, suffering and despair, but only to be led decisively out of their shadows into the light of true life. We mark our entry into Holy Week in a tangible way: we gather outdoors and march to church, holding palm crosses and singing hymns. Upon arriving at St George's, we enter further into the mystery of salvation by a dramatic reading of the passion narrative and finish with the Eucharist, waiting for Easter. Palm Sunday embodies the unstoppable momentum of God's love. In the Palm Gospel's account of Jesus's entry into Jerusalem, God's humble and gentle love is revealed in how Jesus subverts all expectations of power and majesty by riding into the city on a donkey. But a tension mounts between the momentum of God's love and human violence and the reality of suffering. Though the crowds offer Jesus gifts of branches and shouts of praise, later the crowds turn on Jesus when they shout crucify him. In the Northern Hemisphere, the clash of these forces seems to echo in the natural world. All around us creation is coming to life in the colour and sounds of spring. At the same time, we are aware of swathes of people whose lives are devasted by war, tyranny, poverty, ecological destruction. This collision should make our hearts cry out. Surely this calls for what God achieves in Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. And, indeed, our lament is met by love's drumbeat at Easter and in all those who respond to suffering not with denial or despair but with hope, solidarity, generosity, and compassion. In face of the shifting sands of suffering, let our feet too touch solid holy ground as we march together under the banner of God's love for all. With my prayers and blessings,
