Happy Easter to you all! Christ is risen! Easter is a celebration of the victory of love. Easter is the first day of the new creation when in lesus Christ, crucified and risen, God reveals that life - life given over to others, life that springs forth from from dying to ourselves to live for others - to be stronger than death. The Easter story is not simply about what happens to Jesus.
